better. Through several grants, Calabrese Park playground has been upgraded, and a walking path with adult exercise equipment is being installed. Thanks to our many wonderful volunteers, other parks also have been "spruced" up to be even more inviting for residents. Through a NJDOT Municipal Aid grant, the Township began a sidewalk project along Williamstown Road in Sicklerville to better connect our residents to local points of interest in the town. This project will continue in the spring/summer to include parts of Sicklerville Road. In addition, the Township completed a pavement microsurfacing project in several residential developments, as well as in the Township Municipal Complex. This project helps ensure the longevity of the pavement, thus delaying future replacement costs.

The Township also finalized several renovation projects in the Municipal Complex to make services more accessible and convenient for residents, and at the same time ensure better security and safety for staff and residents.

Camden County completed a much needed traffic light at Tansboro & Factory roads. The County also will be paving Tansboro Road this spring/summer from the Berlin area to Route 73 at the high school. The County will be working on several other roadway projects in the future in Winslow.

The Township will continue to work closely with the Winslow Township School District to enhance the educational opportunities available to our students.

Together, we continue to make Winslow Township a great place to live, work and play!

Junior Police Academy Sign-Up

The Winslow Township Police Department will be hosting two (2), week-long Junior Police Academies. The Academies will be broken up into Tier 1 and Tier 2. In order to be eligible for Tier 2, applicants must have completed the Tier 1 program during a previous year.

The Junior Police Academies will cover a number of topics including, but not limited to, History of Law Enforcement, Gangs, Motor Vehicle Law, DWI Enforcement, Teens and Drug Use, Crime Scene and Evidentiary Processing, Fire/EMS Services, CPR Training, K-9, and SWAT. Each day will end with an hour of light physical training and military drill.

The dates for the academies this year are: July 18-22, 2016 (Tier 1); and, July 25-29, 2016 (Tier 2).

A Message from the Winslow Township **School District Superintendent**

Our vision for the Winslow Township School District is to provide a culturally rich, academically strong and challenging, educational environment to ensure the success for all students. To enhance our vision, the Winslow Township Board of Education adopted District Goals that impact student achievement at all levels.

PARCC Scores Reflect Emphasis on Teaching and Learning

In our elementary schools, we continue to emphasize teaching and learning by placing state of the art technology in every instructional classroom, and by providing our staff with ongoing professional development. The results of our efforts were reflected in our Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) scores. At the middle school level, we expanded our course offerings by adding new courses that are more challenging and geared toward college and careers (i.e. Environmental Science (STEM) and Journalism). Field trips for these new courses are designed to give our students hands-on experiences at various on-site locations and, at the same time, expose our students to countless college and career opportunities. We also added a Life Skills Class to our Middle School Special Education Curriculum to support our students with special needs. At the high school, we continue to increase our course offerings by expanding our AP and Honors Classes and by developing courses that are more college- and career-oriented.

Most of our lower elementary students - in the first year of testing - met or exceeded the state or national average in English Language Arts or Mathematics. We believe our efforts to meet the highest educational standards are reflected in our PARCC results. At the middle school level, our eighth-graders exceeded the state and national average in Algebra I, and scored among the top students in the State of New Jersey. At the high school level, we have met our performance goals for the past four years in English Language Arts and Mathematics. Last year's PARCC results indicated that our tenth- and eleventh-graders exceeded state and national averages in English Language

Arts, and our Algebra II and Geometry students exceeded the state and national averages in Mathematics.

Interscholastic Athletics Had Great Start

In interscholastic athletics, our teams are off to a great start. With a 500 season in football, the team produced our first All-American in six years with **Devon Robinson** being selected to play in the Blue Gray High School All-Star Game. In Boys' Basketball, our team won its second consecutive Sectional Championship, for the first time in the history of the program. The team is led by Michael Cubbage, who joined the 1,000 point club this season. In Wrestling, Keshawn Branham won his 100th wrestling match, to become only the sixth wrestler in Winslow Township Wrestling history to accomplish this goal. Also in wrestling, for the first time in 10 years, we have four district champions, Keshawn Branham (152 lbs.), Charles McCall (160 lbs.), Rashad Gayle (182 lbs.), and Timothy Miles (220 lbs.). The Girls' Soccer team finished their second consecutive winning season with a playoff berth and both of the team captains, Tziarra King (North Carolina State) and Vashti Williams (Georgetown University), were signed to full athletic scholarships. In Girls' Basketball, the Lady Eagles won their first Patriot Division title. This is the first championship in Girls' Basketball since the district changed from Edgewood to Winslow, 15 years ago. Our Girls' Indoor Track Team won their fifth Group III Sectional Championship in 6 years and finished second in the Group III State Finals. Flora Ahiarakwe finished first in the 400 meter dash and the 4x400 meter relay team (lyianna Williams, Flora Ahiarakwe, Nicole Berry, and Brittany Preston) finished first at the State Meet running 4:00 minutes flat. The Girls' 4x400 Relay Team is currently ranked second in the State of New Jersey.

As for the future of Girls Track and Field at Winslow Township High School, Tionna Tobias, a freshman competing in the long jump for only the second time as a high schooler, jumped 18'9" at the Eastern State Championship, the best jump ever indoors by a New Jersey freshman and overall, the 5th best in South Jersey history! Presently, Tionna is the number one freshman indoor long jumper in the United States.

Standouts in the Arts...

In the Performing Arts, Winslow Township High School had five students (Callianna Amilcare, George Parker, Allison Anderson, Jason Soto, and Kirk Slingluff) selected to the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) Eastern Division Honors Choir. This is the most students to receive this honor in the same year from Winslow Township High School. We also had several students selected to the All-South Jersey and All-State Choirs. Instrumentally, we had two students (Yasmeen Simmons and Martin Juarez) selected to the All-South Jersey Orchestra.

... And in Science

Winslow Township High School also is being represented at the national level. Alyssa Evringham, a senior, has been selected to represent our high school as a National Youth Delegate to the 2016 Washington Youth Summit on the Environment at George Mason University. Khan Clark, a senior, has been selected as a Delegate representing our high school at the Congress of Future Science and Technology Leaders, to be held in Boston, Massachusetts, for academically superior high school students dedicated to careers in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics.

Updates on Capital Improvements

This year, the Board also approved several Capital Improvement Projects. The installation of new windows is complete at the High School and the new window installation at the Middle School is near completion. The expansion project (a new gymnasium and 11 classrooms) at School No. 4 is underway with a completion date of Spring 2017. The new entrance renovations at the High School will begin at the end of this school year and will be completed for the opening of next year (September 2016). These projects are being completed without a referendum or a need to raise taxes.

"What's Up in Winslow"

As we continue to look for more ways to engage our community and keep everyone informed, the Marketing Committee of the Board implemented the District's new talk show, "What's Up in Winslow." This talk show was hosted by our high school students Clyde Killebrew and Savannah Page. The show highlighted the successes of our staff and students; the program was a huge success. Our next scheduled program is April 27, 2016.

The Winslow Township School District will continue to improve and explore better ways to provide educational services to our students and community. Working together, we can ensure a successful educational experience for all of our students.
